It exempts farm signs from the Florida Building Code and any county or municipal fees or codes, with some restrictions where city and county rules or codes still apply:

1. Signs cannot be placed within 100 feet of any church, school, cemetery, public park, reservation, or playground, or state or national forest.

2. Signs cannot be lighted in any way that causes glare or distracts or impairs the vision of motorists

3. Signs cannot be decorated with the words "stop" or "danger".

4. Signs cannot obstruct the view of approaching vehicles.

5. Signs cannot be located on the right of way of public thoroughfares.

Live Oak — Southeastern Suwannee County landowners need to be on the look out for Cinara aphids, senior forester Brian Cobble said. "The insect outbreak has grown to epidemic proportions. The tiny insects are currently feeding on slash pines, on six different slash pine stands, with 328 acres identified in the outbreak location. The known number of aphids is in the millions and could be under-estimated," Cobble said.

There was a pest alert recently released by the Florida Division of Plant Industry regarding the Genus of Aphids. It stated that the Cinara aphids came in to Florida on fresh-cut Christmas trees imported from other states. According to S usan Halbert, taxonomic entomologist for the FDPI, the Cinara aphids "do not transmit any human or animal pathogens. There is no need to treat the trees with insecticide." The aphids look like "engorged ticks" but they have only six legs and are harmless to humans and animals because they only feed on their host plant Halbert said.

The insects were reported in early January, Cobble said, in a pine stand on 256th Street, five miles east of O'Brien. "The tiny sap -sucking insects have since been noted in more adjacent pine stands within the last three weeks and seem to be continuing to expand their current population size," Cobble said. Aphids and ants thrive together, Cobble said. He added that the ants feed on the honeydew excretion from the aphids. He said that evidence shows that many Cinara species cannot survive without the ants. "One of the reasons an 'Aphid Bloom ' can be so serious, is that female aphids can reproduce without the assistance of the male, for several consecutive generations," Cobble said.

According to the Ohio State University Extension office, "Heavy populations may stunt shoot elongation or cause some needle drop. These aphids produce considerable amounts of honeydew which is soon covered with black sooty mold. Cinara attacks to seedlings have been known to kill some plants," For more information on aphids, or to report a possible outbreak, contact Cobble at 386-364-5314.

Aphids also effect older Sand Pine trees. Shake trees and use household insect spray very lightly if aphids are found on tree.

The Division of Forestry--Andrews Nursery, Chiefland, FL, Phone 352-493-6096, currently has bare root Sand Pine at \$45. per thousand. Seeds have become scarce and they are not currently producing the containerized Sand Pine.

Southern Christmas Tree Plantation, (Bill Murray), Cordele, GA, (See advertisement) has Leland Cypress, Murray Cypress, and others in liners, in gallons and in three gallons. Phone 229-273-5748. The Murray Cypress seems to be the most disease resistant.

Aucker's Nursery, Williston, FL, (See Advertisement), phone 352-528-3889, has very nice Leland Cypress liners, and three to twenty-five gallon containerized. They were short of supply for last year. They have a very nice educational Web Site: www.auckersnursery.com

BK Cedars (Hilton Biggs and Susan Kossuth), Alachua, FL Phone 386-462-2060 has a good supply of three gallon and one gallon genetically improved Southern Red Cedar ('Robin Blue') suitable for initial or replacement planting. I get a few of these to sell to customers who are thinking of digging a small tree. It is easier than digging, and I plant whatever is left over. Michael



First Annual All Florida AG Show April 25-26, 2012 Sebring, Florida

Linda and I attended the **First Annual Florida AG Show** in Sebring, Florida. I had a great time; she would rather go to Disney World. They had over 60 vendors from many areas but the show was tilted toward citrus, and various alternative crops.

The meeting started with a presentation by Adam Putnam, our Commissioner of Agriculture, and then went on to a presentation on Water Policy Today and in the Future. The theme was that there will be numerous demands for water and the Agricultural Community must stand together to guard our interests.

Florida Farm Bureau was one of the primary sponsors. They track legislation on many farm issues. For example, Florida passed a farm sign ordinance that supersedes most county ordinances. They are currently following child labor on farms legislation. Members can get a monthly update by email.

I talked with a representative of Stockosorb which manufactures superabsorbent polymers. They manufacture a product we know as Terra Sorbe which is marketed by another corporation. We have purchased this product from Wesley Bass in three pound units. We add about three table spoons in 2.5 gal of water in a 5 gal bucket to hold transplants on the way to the field for planting.

Stockosorb is sold in 55 pound bags, mostly to be disc into fields to hold more moisture for plants. This product is also marketed by another corporation in smaller quantities, but I haven't located a local vendor yet.

I talked with several vendors on irrigation materials, and received instructions and emitters. I'm planning to try some limited irrigation for new sand pine trees.

There were sessions on growing and marketing Blue Berries, peaches, and pomegranates. The cost of the two day program was \$25. per person paid in advance and \$45 paid at the event. The costs included light breakfast and a BBQ lunch with chicken and ribs for each of the two days. They are planning this to be an annual event. We brought home two shower heads, samples of Stockosorb, two avocado plants, and two calculators.
