**Superior Nursery at Lee, Florida**. Phone 850-971-5159 They have increased the cost of bare root Southern Red Cedar to (\$250 per thousand). They have Sand Pine, and Virginia Pine seedlings (\$100 per thousand.) and Spruce Pine (\$120 per thousand) available for the Fall Season.

**Dwight Stansel Farm & Nursery**, 5553 164<sup>th</sup> St, Wellborn, FL 32094, Phone 386-963-2827, e-mail [dsfntte@windstream.net] raises bare root Southern Red Cedar which they sell for \$218 per thousand.

**The Division of Forestry--Andrews Nursery**, Chiefland, FL, Phone 352-493-6096, will have bare root Sand Pine at \$50 per thousand. They currently have containerized (Plugs) Sand Pine available for \$200 per thousand.

**Southern Christmas Tree Plantation, (Bill Murray**), Cordele, GA, (See advertisement) has Leland Cypress, Murray Cypress, and others in liners, in gallons and in three gallons. Phone 229-273-5748. The Murray Cypress seems to be the most disease resistant.

She also has three gallon (\$7) Carolina Sapphires. I get a few of these to sell to customers who are thinking of digging a small tree. It is easier than digging, and I plant whatever is left over. #### Fire Safety & Christmas Trees

For years, we have all seen or read stories in the news that real Christmas Trees can be a fire hazard. For the sake of this discussion, I would like start it in a little different manner than usual. Let's build a typical Christmas tree setting in most households in reverse. Presents: lots & lots of them all stacked on top of each other. They are in cardboard boxes and then covered in wrapping paper topped with beautiful frilly bows. Most of these are toys and in most cases, they are made of plastic. We all know that all of these materials are extremely flammable and many of us have used most of these same materials in the same configuration to start a fire. All you need is a heat source. Lights: Hundreds and hundreds of them wrapped in a tight pattern. Many are within inches of the presents and there is a good chance that they could be touching them. Anyone that has ever tried to change a light bulb that has been on very long or any girl that grew up with an easy bake oven knows some light bulbs can get hot. I'm sure just about every fire chief in the country would tell you that you have a fire hazard at this stage. Overload your electrical circuit, and it just became a major hazard. Tree: A fresh cut, real tree is not flammable. And if you keep it hydrated, it will not become so. But as with many other things including artificial trees, can burn with enough heat from below. As long as you take care of your tree, it is not a fire hazard.

I did not bring up this topic to be a Scrooge or scare people away from putting up a Christmas tree. With a little common sense, you can safely continue your family Christmas traditions.

An easy way to test the lights that you have is to turn them on for 30 minutes & then try to touch the bulb. If you cannot hold the bulb in your hand throw them away. LEDs are good & use much less electricity but modern incandescent can be safe to use as long as they pass the heat test. Inspect your lights before putting them up. Don't let your lights or wiring touch the presents under the tree. This goes for artificial tree users also.

If you are using a real tree, make sure that you get it into water within an hour or so, the sooner, the better. If longer than this, all you need to do is cut about ½ inch off the trunk to revive it. Make sure you keep your water level checked. This is very important in the first 2 or 3 days. Larger trees can drink a gallon per day in the first couple of days. If it runs out, the trunk can seal off & the tree will be unable to drink anymore water. This could be corrected as above but much more difficult on a decorated tree.

If you have fireplace & plan to use it, I know it looks romantic in pictures but don't put your tree near the fireplace. The dry heat will dehydrate your tree very quickly.

Each Christmas Tree Farm can have its own Facebook account. Word about your Christmas Tree Farm can spread exponentially starting with just one "like".

With Instagram you can take a picture and have it framed and filtered for viewing. You must have a Smart phone in order to read an Instagram site.

Pintrest is an on-line bookmarking site with a fee. It is more time consuming. Our website pictures can be transferred to the customer's Pintrest account so we are not forgotten. Hash tag numbers are part of Instagram or Twitter and a Facebook platform can be used as well.

Hootsuite (logo is an owl) will post your schedule for the public to view.

Susie encouraged us to "Share a little Florida Sunshine" by posting photos about what you like about Florida.

Ben Parks: Executive Director, Florida Agritourism Association (850-559-1155) provided a hand out of the Florida Statues on Agritourism: 570.961. Agritourism activity means "any agricultural related activity consistent with a bona fide farm or ranch or in a working forest which allows members of the general public, for recreational, entertainment, or educational purposes, to view or enjoy activities, including farming, ranching, historical, cultural, or harvest-your-own activities and attractions." Florida also has a Tourist-oriented directional sign program (TODS). 2014 Florida Statues 479.262 in which provisions for placing signs along state roads is discussed. There is an opportunity for the State to help Christmas tree growers make signs. The contact person at the Department of Transportation is Christopher Lewis, Highway Signing Program: 850-410-5581.

Mike Kelley, a new BOD member, has offered to have the fall 2015 meeting at Whispering Pines Christmas Tree Farm. Cathie Gregory and Bob Neilson currently serve as the other BOD members. Jack Ewing is the temporary Chairman for "Trees for Troops". Jack and Judy Ewing's Santa's Christmas Tree Forest has provided trees for the program for years.
